







## Laurier Cold Regions Research Centre to host lecture on caribou decline in Northwest Territories

Waterloo – Northwest Territories biologist Jan Adamczewski and Tłįchǫ Nation government representative John B. Zoe will present a guest lecture at Wilfrid Laurier University on declining caribou populations Feb. 5 at 2:30 p.m. in the Paul Martin Centre.

The joint presentation is hosted by <u>William Quinton</u>, director of Laurier's Cold Regions Research Centre, and <u>Colin Robertson</u>, associate professor in Laurier's Geography and

Environmental Studies program, through the <u>Global Water Citizenship</u> project funded by <u>Global Water Futures</u>, the largest university-led water research program funded worldwide.

"This talk is an opportunity to learn about sharing ways of knowing about critical changes to caribou populations and how different types of knowledge might be used together to inform planning and decision making," said Robertson. "The Global Water Citizenship project is about integrating local and community observations of environmental change with scientific knowledge and techniques to help decision-makers make informed choices about policy and governance."

The guest lecture entitled, "<u>History of Bathurst Caribou and the Tłįcho People: Managing in a Time of Scarcity</u>," will provide an overview of current Bathurst caribou management practices and the history of Tłįcho adaptation to fluctuating caribou abundance with historic influences like the fur trade.
